SCHOOLS AND GROUPS SAFETY INFORMATION AND RISK ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

Supervision of students

- As per our terms and conditions, students aged 16 or under must be accompanied by a designated adult at all times within the Zoo.
 To enable you to do this we have generous free adult to child ratios which will have been communicated with you on booking. Post-16 students do not need to be with an adult but accompanying staff must remain within the zoo to supervise and be contactable during the trip.
- You are responsible for supervising your groups at all times. Any disruptive behaviour to DZS staff, animals or other visitors that is deemed to be aggressive or compromise the health and well-being of public or animals will be dealt with accordingly and the whole group may be asked to leave the zoo site.

Lost child procedure

• In the event of a lost child, please speak to the nearest member of DZS staff or volunteer. They will initiate our lost child procedure. Our designated safe space on site is the restaurant so please pass this on to your children in the event of them being separated from the group.

Personal belongings

• DZS can provide a safe place for storing any bags, however DZS takes no responsibility for any lost or stolen item.

First Aid

• There is always a designated First Aider on duty each day. In the event of a first aid incident, please contact the nearest DZS staff or volunteer and they will contact the duty first aider and coordinate with emergency services, if required.

Public liability insurance

• We hold public liability insurance up to the value of £8 million through Hiscox Insurance Company Ltd and Zurich Insurance Company Ltd. A copy of the certificate is available on request.
